Go through the following questions that will help you to figure out your career needs and interests. Ask yourself these questions before moving further with the job searching process.

What are your skills? What career do you want to choose for yourself? (Abilities and Experiences)

Which field of work suits you perfectly? Identify and make a list of your skills. Do not waste energy on thinking about specific job titles but the field of your interest.

Do you have any specific industry or employer in mind? For example, do you want to work for a startup, family-friendly environment, etc.? Whatever ideas come in mind regarding your preferred industry scribble them down.

Which location suites you? Are you fine with relocation? (Location)

Are you willing to move to another city or state to work in a specific industry? Or do you want to stay where you are and look for jobs near your home?

Take time out and do your research on the industry you are interested in. Check out for the organizations that are offering relevant job positions.

Which job vacancies are available related to your interests?

Do not look out for specific job titles. Make a list of vacancies available that match your interests and skills. For example, if you want to go into the education field, then do not look for a specific teaching job. You can also apply for positions such as department researcher, director, etc.

FINDING OUT DETAILS ABOUT THE JOB ROLE

Once you are done with the questions mentioned above, the next step is to focus on the job description for the position for which you are applying. If you are finding it difficult to decide what role suits you, then you can contact a career counselor as well.
