| In order for a course to meet the general education writing learning outcome, the course must: |
| 1. Carry the same prerequisite requirement as ENGL 102A (i.e. ENGL 101A or AP credit). |

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2. Require a major formal paper or papers, such as a literature review, essay, research or laboratory report, reflective work or researched argument, over the course of the semester. Formal writing

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should comprise at least 40% of the total course grade. In addition, the course should require informal writing (journals, reading responses, reaction papers, in-class writing, and/or essay exams) throughout the semester.

State clearly how writing objectives will be incorporated into course design and assessment.

3. Devote class time to instruction and work on writing: developing thesis statements, creating organizational structure, using sources effectively and responsibly, employing proper grammar and mechanics, and discipline-specific writing requirements.

State clearly how this objective will be met.

4. Require that select assignments go through more than one draft, with feedback from instructor and peers.

State clearly how this objective will be met.

 - **a.** Assignment sheets for formal writing assignments.
 - b. Course syllabus, listing all informal and formal writing assignments and indicating that formal writing will comprise at least 40% of the final grade.
