- I. Welcome and Introductions
- II. Old Business
 - a. Approval of previous minutes
 - i. K.J. made a motion to accept the minutes; motion was seconded
 - b. CAEP Update
 - Report was submitted in July; formative feedback should be received by December
 - ii. 7 programs were reported on
 - iii. Melanie Gribble explain the CAEP process
 - Ok to have areas of improvement and stipulations as both can be corrected
 - iv. Hope to have a schedule of the virtual site visit by February
 - 1. Virtual site visit will take place April 28-30, 2025

III. New Business

- a. WVDE Update
 - i. Presented by Teresa Bailey
 - ii. WV has been in a study decline of teachers graduating from EPPs
 - 1. Usage of non-cert teachers has doubled since 2015
 - 2. Suggested to try to have field see a whole day and not the same snapshot.
- b. Revised Programs-Physical Education

- i. PE had too much content- removed courses that were not needed or had material that was covered in other courses
 - Will pay attention to which state a candidate would like to teach in and will research to make sure student is receiving the certifications that are needed
 - 2. Moved PSYC-216/217 to content
- ii. Was missing an entire semester of field
- iii. Potential for PE/ Health to merge to Wellness to streamline candidate ability to complete the program.
 - Lindsey Stell agreed as WV Content Standards are Wellness Education
- c. Admission, Retention and Exit Criteria
 - i. TEP Admission requirements have not changed
 - ii. Requiring Praxis Content to be attempted before Residency I
 - iii. Exit
 - 1. PPAT will not be an option after SP25
 - 2. Moving towards WVTPA
 - a. Certain states are not accepting WVTPA
 - i. Adding PLT for those students should fix this but will be case-by-case
 - iv. Math 5-A is growing; most double majoring or minoring in SPED
 - v. Want to move PE/Health towards Wellness to meet current standards and make students more marketable
- d. Assessment
 - i. Pre-Professional Skills (Praxis CASE)
 - 1. High reading scores are being reported
 - 2. Writing-Struggling
 - Jess Vida explained the remediation plan the department has put in place and the success we are having with it
 - ii. Content (Praxis II)
 - Elem has two options- multi-subjects (5000 series) and CKT (7000 series)
 - Can make looking at the data difficult but candidates are able to mix and match from the tests
 - iii. Professional Education (PPAT)
 - 1. Students are consistently scoring above the cut score
 - a. Ours 40; State 38

- 2. Shows we are struggling in assessment practices
- e. Clinical & Field Experiences
 - i. First cohort to complete Residency I
 - 1. 4 Elem
 - 2. 1 SPED
 - 3. 1 Elem and SPED
 - ii. Residency II and Subbing
 - 1. Policy 5100 states 1 day per week in host school
 - a. 23-24 waiver has been extended- may sub a total of 10 days a month
 - i. 5 days in host classroom; 5 days in host school
 - iii. Field Experience
 - 1. Students are not to be sitting; they are to be actively engaged
- f. Recruitment of Students (Grow Your Own)
 - i. Starting SP25 with Randolph County
 - 1. Will take EDUC-120
 - a. Offering hybrid and in person
 - ii. There is currently still funding for this program so the students will be able to take the course for free
 - iii. Have been reaching out to Barbour and Tucker Counties
